




WEEK IN REVIEW



KARTING 101




WEEK IN REVIEW


WEEK IN REVIEW



Youth covered the creative preproduction process, which included determining the video concept, selecting suitable music, setting up three-point lighting, and taking professional headshots. They also learned the basics of video and audio editing/production, as well as photo editing and color correction.



Youth learned that Pre-production is a crucial phase in the video production process where all planning and preparation take place before filming begins. During this stage, several key activities are undertaken to ensure a smooth production process. Determining the video concept involves brainstorming and deciding on the main idea or message, defining the target audience, setting objectives, and outlining the storyline or script. Selecting suitable music is essential for setting the tone and mood of the video, and may involve choosing royalty-free tracks or composing original ones. Setting up three-point lighting, which includes key light, fill light, and backlight, helps illuminate the subject evenly, reduce shadows, and add depth to the scene. Taking professional headshots is also important for introducing individuals featured in the video or for promotional purposes. Additionally, learning the basics of video and audio editing/production, as well as photo editing and color correction, is essential to ensure high-quality final output.
